### FACT SHEET

The Office of Emergency Management would like to express to **all** citizens of Maury County, Tennessee that the county and the affected cities are continuing to do everything possible to evaluate and assist citizens affected by the weekend floods.

If you have had damage to the living area of your home, please visit the county website and go to [Maury County Emergency Flood Damage Report Form](#) and fill it out or phone number **931-375-1515**. This will let us know where damage has occurred.

Officials also recommend that residents document damages to their property by taking photographs.

Definition of 100 year flood = A one percent chance of the flood being equaled or exceeded or in a given year. This does not mean that if you had a 100 year flood that you are safe for another 100 years nor that you will not be flooded again in the immediate future.

Not all areas of Maury County received flood elevations of 100 year flood. If you live in a flood zone and were not impacted by this flood, don't think that you are safe. **Keep your flood insurance** or get it! If you do not have flood insurance it is available in Maury County by all insurance companies, they are required to have it available.

Buildings that are **structurally damaged** within the flood zone must have the repairs permitted by the appropriate office. **PERMIT IS REQUIRED!**

We want to remind all residents to **never** drive or walk across a flooded roadway. Also if roads are blocked by signs or barricades, do not attempt to go around them. Even if a road is not covered by water, it might have been compromised from the floods and may not be safe to travel on. Anyone caught removing a barricade or driving around them will be prosecuted.
